## TRAIL AND TRANSPORTATION ISSUES TO BE DISCUSSED AT OPEN HOUSE, JAN. 20

"The Road Ahead for Lake Tahoe" Agenda Includes Plan for Fanny Bridge and Roadway
Improvement, Tahoe Lakeview Trail Access
