SERIES OF PUBLIC WORKSHOPS SET FOR SR 28 CORRIDOR

Ridge-to-shoreline plan stretching from Crystal Bay to Sand Harbor to Spooner Lake

Sept. 28, 2012 (*Stateline, Nev.*) – The Tahoe Transportation District is hosting four public workshops to provide information and gather questions and opinions regarding the National Scenic Byway (SR28). The workshops will be held in– Reno/Sparks, Incline Village and Carson City – to obtain significant public participation. (<http://www.tahoetransportation.org>)

The SR 28 corridor stretches from Crystal Bay to Sand Harbor to Spooner Lake – creating a ridge-to-shoreline plan that will help keep Lake Tahoe’s waters clear, improve safety and offer convenient access to outdoor recreation.
